normal - as part of a business acquisition. A line of related research was already under way at UCF's College of Optics and Photonics.

"It was a natural for us to donate that technology here," said Tom Romesser, a Northrop Grumman Space Technology vice president. "It forges a very strong partnership with UCF."

Computer production relies on ultraviolet-light lasers to imprint tiny technical features on a chip's surface. The new technology - called extreme ultraviolet lithography - uses shorter wavelengths to

make smaller chips.

The gift includes 11 patents and 10 applications in ultraviolet technology and related fields, valued by an independent appraiser at \$22 million, in addition cash and equipment worth \$2 million to develop the technology.

With the donation, "UCF stands taller than national programs in Europe and Japan," said optics professor Martin Richardson, professor of X-ray photonics at UCF. "We now have this very great strength in patents."

The school's optics college will name a lab in honor of Los Angeles-based Northrop Grumman, which will also get a tax break for the donation to a nonprofit state university. The details of the tax break weren't released.
